










If the departure times of the regular buses don't suit your desired tour, consider making use of RufBus Berchtesgaden. By making a reservation at least two hours before your preferred travel time, you'll be picked up or dropped off at a stop within the extended bus network. RufBus Berchtesgaden operates from 7:00 am to 10:00 pm. The reservation hotline is open from 8:00 am to 9:00 pm. The fare for the journey is based on the fare zones of the regular bus network. You can obtain a brochure with additional information about RufBus Berchtesgaden at the local tourist information.








NATURE AND MOUNTAIN EXPERIENCES

Float up to the summit, venture deep inside the mountain, or hike through cavernous gorges: If you love the Alps, Berchtesgaden is certain to set your pulse racing in pure anticipation. Glide towards the mountaintops in the panoramic gondolas of the ultramodern Jennerbahn, visit the world-famous Eagle's Nest amid high-alpine landscapes, visit the spectacular ice cave on the Untersberg, and ride the mine train into the historic salt mine! And this is just a small selection of the unforgettable experiences waiting for you here in Berchtesgaden.







Jennerbahn

Float up to Berchtesgaden National Park. The Jennerbahn cableway next to Lake Königssee takes you up to 1,800 m above sea level, right into the heart of the hiking paradise inside Berchtesgaden National Park. The ride on the completely glasssided gondolas allows you to enjoy breathtaking views of the surrounding mountain world. From the mid- or top station, countless hiking paths and trails lead across alpine pastures and high peaks. The lookout point iust below the Jenner summit cross affords a spectacular view of Lake Königssee

far below. The National Park Info Point at the top station is well worth a visit in its own right, presenting a lot of interesting information about the rare flora and unique fauna native to this nature sanctuary.

Inviting places to stop for refreshments include the JENNERALM, a restaurant at the top station with a panorama terrace, as well as the HALBZEIT at the midstation. In winter, rookie skiers can practice their first turns inside Kinderland and on the blue-rated piste by the mid-station. Experience breathtaking nature. Take relaxing walks in hiking boots or snowshoes. Or perhaps an exhilarating sled ride instead. The JENNER-HEX promises enormous fun for the whole family.

Kehlsteinhaus | Eagle's Nest

The Eagle's Nest is situated above Berchtesgaden at an altitude of 1,834 meters. Its history is inseparably linked to that of the Obersalzberg. Between 1933 and 1945, it served as a significant center of power for the Nazi dictatorship, second only to Berlin. It was the place where decisions regarding persecution, war, and genocide were made.

Constructed in 1937/38, the tea house was intended to serve as a political venue away from the public eye, aimed at impressing guests. After a steep mountain road, a passage leads through a tunnel to an elevator, which takes guests

up approximately 124 meters directly into the tea house itself. There, they are greeted by a breathtaking view of the surrounding mountain ranges.

In reality, the significance of the house during the Nazi era was limited. Hitler rarely visited to host diplomats or other foreign guests. More often, it was used by the Nazi entourage gathered at the Obersalzberg for recreation and private celebrations. Since 1952, the building has been utilized as a mountain restaurant and has become a tourist hotspot. The structure has largely remained original, while almost all other buildings on

the Obersalzberg from the Nazi era have vanished. An exhibition provides information about the history of the Eagle's Nest as well as its connection to Hitler and the Obersalzberg.

Berchtesgaden Salt Mine

Slithering down into the depths of the Berchtesgaden Salt Mine is one of those childhood memories that last a lifetime.

In the oldest still-active salt mine in Germany, the miners take you into a fascinating subterranean world.

For young and old, this 90-minute guided tour is an exciting excursion, regardless of the weather outside. Intriguing facts about "white gold" meld with highlights such as the miners' slides, the ride on the mine train, and a light

show over the mirror-like underground lake.

Rossfeld Scenic Road

The highest scenic road in Germany – highest point 1570 m above sea level – leads into the heart of Berchtesgaden's unique mountain world, with views of Salzburg City and the Salzach River Valley. There

are several hiking routes including a marvelous panoramic path with info boards and benches to rest.

Your eyes wander from the Hoher Göll, across the Kehlstein and legendary Untersberg, to the Dachstein and Tennengebirge. Two mountain inns and a kiosk (with handicappedaccessible WC) invite you to make a refreshment stop. The toll road is passable year-round.

TEISENDORFER BEER TRAIL


Craving a refreshing brew?

Of course, when you embark on the Teisendorfer Beer Trail, it's all about that beloved hop-infused beverage. The Wieninger private brewery is a seventh-generation family-run business.

This leisurely hiking trail takes you through lush farmland and verdant forests. Keep an eye out for the hop vines as they lead you to a total of ten info boards about the history of beer and its various components, punctuated by cozy benches to take a breather. And if you want to treat your taste buds, stop by either Klosterwirt Höglwörth or Braugasthof Alte Post in Teisendorf for a snack with some liquid accompaniment.

TIP: During the week, you can shorten the return trip by catching the local bus (No. 829).






ALMBACHKLAMM AND ETTENBERG

Rushing mountain stream and Baroque frescoes

The hike through the Almbach gorge is a true adventure. Even the starting point, Germany's oldest still-operating marble mill, is highly fascinating. Since 1683, waterpower has been used here to grind balls made of Untersberg marble. The well-maintained trail through the gor-

ge offers exciting glimpses into the depths, where the raging mountain stream, waterfalls and pools can be admired. Further along, the gorge opens up into a lovely valley. At our destination, we are greeted by the picturesque Ettenberg pilgrimage church, a snack at the neighboring Mes-

nerwirt, and a magnificent view. The steep Hammerstielwand path leads back to the starting point.


TO THE TOP OF THE TOTER MANN

Calming mountain panorama

The Toter Mann and Hirscheck are neighboring peaks high above Germany's first Bergsteigerdorf (mountaineer-friendly village) - Ramsau near Berchtesgaden. The trail,

also maintained for winter hikers, leads to the summit in about 1.5 hours. Just a short 15-minute walk away is the Hirschkaser mountain inn. The return hike follows the same path - or ride the Hirscheck chairlift down to the valley instead.

Join an extraordinary excursion to the Toter Mann! At nine stations along this interactive trail, you will get to know Johann Grill and Rose von Rosthorn-Friedmann. The mountain guide from Ramsau, who was the first to climb the East Face of the Watzmann in 1881, and the female climber who successfully tackled this same challenging route in 1896, share astonishing and impressive stories about the mountains of Berchtesgaden.


GRÜNSTEIN AND KÜHROINT

Two for one

This tour requires slightly stronger calf muscles: the ascent to the Grünstein is consistently steep. There, you will have the first opportunity to take a break: the Grünsteinhütte rewards you before, or after, the highly recommended detour to the very summit. From the summit of the

Grünstein, you are treated to a sublime view of the Watzmann. Next comes a varied passage leading to the alpine meadows of the Kühroint. We also suggest a side trip to the Archenkanzel with its unique view of St. Bartholomä below. After a rest amid the pastures or at the mountain hut, return

to the starting point via the forestry road and the Schapbachalm.






STEINERNE AGNES

Where mushrooms out of rock grow

The Steinerne Agnes has been acclaimed "Bavaria's most beautiful geotope". It is among the most popular photo motifs around Berchtesgaden. First, follow the forestry road towards Bischofswiesen, before ascending a narrow hiking trail meandering swiftly up through sparse deciduous forest until you reach

the tree line, the start of a bizarre karst landscape, crowned by a mushroom-like rock formation. Or is it not a mushroom, but rather the silhouette of the dairymaid Agnes, who was turned into stone as she fled from the devil? In Berchtesgaden's mountain world, you often encounter the mystical world of local

legends. As you drop back down to Winkl, several scenic viewpoints are also great opportunities for a bite to eat.





APPROPRIATE BEHAVIOR INSIDE THE NATIONAL PARK

Let nature be nature!

In Berchtesgaden National Park, plants and animals have been allowed to develop undisturbed for over 40 years. The most important task of a national park is to protect the rich nature while at the same time providing a space for human recreation. This requires mutual respect and consideration. So, do enjoy the rare orchids, lively marmots, tranquil forests, and breathtaking views, but also be sure to strictly abide by the rules of the National Park and teach your children to respect nature as well.

Berchtesgaden National Park is clearly marked on the map with distinct boundaries. However, for visitors the transitions are seamless. There are no tickets, entrance checks, or barriers. While hiking, you may find yourself quickly and unexpectedly entering National Park land, such as in Klausbachtal valley outside Ramsau near Berchtesgaden or in the Jenner area. Along the trails, you will encounter signs indicating that you are entering the National Park and what rules apply there to protect the flora and fauna.

We are delighted that you are visiting the National Park. To ensure that our nature remains as beautiful as ever, we kindly ask for your help. You may have already noticed that there are no trash cans in the National Park. That's because everyone packs out their snack leftovers for themselves. The beautiful flowers can be admired but not picked. Please stay on the designated trails to avoid disturbing wildlife. By doing so, chamois, marmots, and other animals won't be scared off, and you may actually have the chance to spot them. Feel free to take photographs, but ref-

rain from using drones, as the animals perceive them as a threat from the sky. By "keeping the volume down", you will hear the many different bird songs in the mountain forest and may even observe Three-toed Woodpeckers, Crossbills, and Tree Pipits. Please refrain from setting up tents or making fires. If everyone shows due consideration, we will all have a fantastic time inside the National Park, and our nature will remain a precious habitat for countless future visitors to come, as well as for the animals and plants that call it home.



THE BEARDED VULTURE PROJECT

Berchtesgaden National Park and the Bavarian Ornithological Society are planning to release additional vultures into the



wild over the next ten years. Some 100 years after their initial extinction, this project aims to facilitate the reintroduction of the largest raptor in Central Europe to the Eastern Alps.



Whereas lakes Königssee, Hintersee and Funtensee are more suitable for cooling your feet after a beautiful hike due to their icy-cold temperatures, you will most definitely feel like diving into the Höglwörther See – one of the warmest lakes in Bavaria.



Sustainability has long been a "big deal" here in Berchtesgaden: In fact, the boats on Lake Königssee have been electrically powered since 1909 – gliding silently and ecofriendly across the crystal-clear water. Today, some 19 almost identically designed boats driven by electric motors carry guests to St. Bartholomew's Pilgrimage Church year-round and, in summer, to Salet at the far end of the lake. The boats are built at a small shipyard right there on Königssee, still true to their traditional design.

The Watzmann Therme and the pleasantly warm outdoor pools of the region are all about family fun and pleasant relaxation. A boat ride across the emerald-green natural jewel that is Lake Königssee, is an absolute must during your vacation in Berchtesgaden – a unique experience.





The reading boards and flyers are in German, so a translation app will be really helpful. Let's explore the Fairytale Path together!






BEE TRAILAn instructive walk for the whole family

The Milky Way Bike Path ("Milchstraßen-Radweg") passes numerous farms that produce fresh Berchtesgaden milk. Starting in Teisendorf, the route initially climbs through several hamlets and villages to the Surbergbichl, in the ad-

jacent Traunstein district. At this point, a detour to the Hochhorn is definitely worthwhile. Then, the route descends through the Surtal valley to Lauter and continues to Schönram. In the last third of the tour, cyclists pass through the villages of

Weildorf, Hörafling, and Rossdorf before returning to Teisendorf. A visit to the Wieninger Brewery and their Bierladl shop is definitely recommended.


KÜHROINT FROM RAMSAUWith View of the Jewel of the Berchtesgaden Alps

The imposing Watzmann accompanies cyclists on this classic mountain biking route, beginning at the Wimbachbrücke at the entrance to Ramsau. Pedaling along the gradually ascending forest road, riders reach the picturesque Schapbachalm.

Passing through what's locally nicknamed the "Gasoline Curve", the path continues to climb to the lush alpine meadows of the Kühroint. There, "recharge your batteries" at one of the authentic inns or huts. During this tour, we also suggest a detour to the awe-

inspiring Archenkanzel, where you are treated to a magnificent vista of the glistening Königssee below, nestled amid the breathtaking peaks of the Berchtesgaden region.








ROSSFELD TOUR

Cycling up to over 1,550 meters by road bike

The Rossfeld Scenic Road, Germany's highest public road, is the destination for this high-alpine cycling tour, involving a climb of ca. 1,000 vertical meters. Starting point is the car park at the Watzmann Therme. Following the Berchtesgadener Ache, the route remains generally flat as far as Unterau. Now taking a right turn, away from the main


road, the ascent begins via the Reckensbergstraße, leading to Oberau and then the Rossfeldstraße. Through numerous hairpins, the road climbs to the highest point of this scenic road (1,560 m above sea level). There, a magnificent view reveals itself, across neighboring Salzburg and the Salzachtal. The sight of the Göll Massif compensates you for the effort you

invested in this challenging climb. Afterwards, coast down the southern side, heading towards the South Toll Station, passing by the Obersalzberg and Dokumentation Obersalzberg, before dropping all the way down to the valley and returning to the starting point.

Dokumentation Obersalzberg is a museum located inside the former Führersperrgebiet outside Berchtesgaden. In its center was Adolf Hitler's Berghof. In a newly designed permanent exhibition, in combination with rotating special exhibitions along with an extensive events program, the Dokumentation informs visitors about the history of this site and the National Socialist dictatorship.

Propaganda exploited the idyllic mountain scenery to portray Hitler as a downto-earth politician, a lover of children and nature, a good neighbor, and statesman. However, the moun-

tain residence was never a holiday spot. Though it did occasionally serve private purposes, it was primarily a representational location and center of power. The Obersalzberg became the second seat of government after Berlin. The dictator spent around one quarter of his time in office here and, together with other leading National Socialist figures, took momentous decisions involving persecution, war, and genocide.

Here, with leaders of the Wehrmacht, he made plans to pursue a criminal war. Today, only a few remnants of Nazi times have survived and the grounds have

been redesigned. Buildings that did survive the end of the war have, for the most part, been demolished since the 1950s. Until 1996, the US military used the Obersalzberg for recreational purposes. After they pulled out in 1999, the Dokumentation was opened.

Dokumentation Obersalzberg had been visited by approximately 3.2 million people as of the end of 2021. As a result, the Free State of Bayaria decided to construct a new building that offered more space for both the permanent exhibition and temporary displays. The former permanent exhibition, which had been in place for 22 years, was dismantled, and the old building was transformed into an educational center.

In September 2023, the Institute of Contemporary History Munich-Berlin unveiled the completely revamped permanent exhibition titled "Idyll and Crime."

THE NOISY "QUIET SEASON"

Of old traditions and contemplative moments in Berchtesgaden

During the run-up to Christmas, known as the "quiet season" in Berchtesgaden, it can actually turn a bit noisy on occasion. Whether the "Butt'nmand'l Lauf" or "Christkind'l Schießen" – you will encounter quite the

array of bangs and jangles reverberating off the mountainsides.

In ancient times, the harsh,

cold winter season felt
especially eerie and



The Kramperl and Butt'nmand'l procession origina-

ted in the Celtic era. When combined with the Saint Nicholas tradition, it became one of the most important Christian rituals in Berchtesgaden. Groups of young unmarried men are "bound" with long stalks of straw. They attach heavy cowbells around their hips and wear intimidating handcarved wooden and fur masks. With clanging bells and wild shouts, these eerie figures roam the villages, especially on December 5th and 6th, accompanied by Saint Nick, and fur-clad Gangerl and Kramperl. Often, there's also a small angel, or the "Nikoloweibi," a boy dressed as a girl. For the public, there isn't all that much to see - more a custom that takes place from home to home. Saint Nicholas and his companions step into houses where they either admonish or reward the children.

Even louder -Volleys in the Valley

gloomy to mountain folk. Centuries ago, the Berchtesgaden locals actually believed that by making lots of noise, they could drive away the spirits of darkness and awaken the springtime.

It gets really loud one week before Christmas when the locals begin their daily tradition of firing off volleys. Over 1,100 Christmas participants gather at various public locations or position themselves in front of their own farms. At exactly three o'clock in the afternoon, it begins: individual muffled shots or powerful salvos from large-caliber hand cannons, accompanied by the ringing of church bells, intended to guide the Christkind to Earth. An unforgettable experience. By the way, the "Vereinigte Weihnachtsschützen" are proud to be part of Bavaria's intangible cultural heritage.

BERCHTESGADEN ADVENT

The historic town center serves as the backdrop for Berchtesgaden Advent, delighting visitors with artisanal crafts, regional products, and cherished traditions. Framed by historic bourgeois homes and the Royal Castle, around fifty lovingly decorated Advent huts are set up. Within this idyllic setting, guests are truly able to savor the Advent atmosphere. Thanks to its unique location in the heart of town, guests have the opportunity to explore not only the Advent huts but also the surrounding inns, restaurants, and numerous local shops.


